### What is a scholarship?

A scholarship is a sum of money or other financial assistance given to you to help support your study. Scholarships are not loans – you do not have to pay back the money, provided you fulfil key requirements such as enrolment, academic performance, work experience or volunteer commitments. Different scholarships have specific eligibility criteria, application procedures and closing dates, so check these carefully early in the process.

## Which scholarships are available?

There are many types of scholarships, including merit-based, needs-based, industry-supported and specialised. This brochure lists the scholarships available specifically to you as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student. But you may also be eligible for other scholarships.

# How to apply

To apply for a scholarship, simply visit our web portal and fill out the application form. We will work through your application and advise you on the scholarships you are eligible for.
